I. Scale Description

The Home Interview with Child (HIWC) has been administered as part of the summer child interview during the first four years of the Fast Track project. The interviewer shows the child a series of eight drawings that depict two types of social situations and reads a brief description of the situations. The pictures and descriptions concern two types of social situations: 1) **Ambiguous Minor Harm** situations where the respondent is asked to pretend he/she has been bumped or hit with a ball and 2) **Unsuccessful Peer Entry** situations ask the respondent to pretend he/she has approached a group, has attempted to join it, and is either explicitly told he/she cannot join the group, or is ignored by the children in the group.

After the interviewer reads each description, he/she asks the child two questions. The first question asks the respondent why he/she thinks the offenders bumped or ignored him/her, and the second question asks what the respondent would do in response to the offense. The eight first ("ask why") questions measure the respondent's interpretation of the offenders' intentions, while the second eight ("what would you do") questions measure the child's behavioral response contingent on the interpretation. Interviewers code responses to questions 1 and 2 into several categories which will be discussed in the scaling section of this report.

II. Report Sample

These exploratory analyses were conducted with the first cohort on the high-risk control sample (n=155) and on the normative sample (n=387, 463 with overlap) from the fourth year of administration of the study; the treatment subjects were not included in these analyses. 56 students were missing responses for the entire scale. Seventeen students from the control sample (5 from Durham, 1 from Nashville, 3 from Pennsylvania, and 8 from Washington) were missing responses. In addition, 47 students from the normative sample (9 from Durham, 11

from Nashville, 11 from Pennsylvania, and 16 from Washington) were missing responses. Several of the missing responses were from subjects in both the normative and control groups. One student (from Pennsylvania) was missing individual items; this student was omitted from the analyses.

III. Scaling

The HIWC generates two open verbal responses about each of eight situations. In total, there are eight responses where the child interprets an offender's intentions and eight responses where the child describes how he would behave in response to the offense. The interviewer codes responses to the **interpretation** questions into one of three categories: hostile, nonhostile, and don't know. Responses to the eight **behavior** questions were coded into one of six categories: don't know, do nothing, ask why/ask again, make a command, threaten adult punishment or make a threat, or retaliate/be aggressive.

The total number of responses in each category is then calculated, yielding a separate count for each of the three interpretation categories and each of the six behavioral response categories. Each of the eight stories generates an interpretation response and a behavioral response, so the category counts have a possible range from one to eight. Eight **interpretation** responses are coded into three categories, and eight **behavioral** responses are coded into six categories.

The percentage of hostile interpretation responses to the eight stories is calculated by dividing the hostile category count by the total number of responses (the sum of all category counts). This score is called *Percent Hostile Attributions*.

The *Aggressive Behaviors Score* is calculated by adding the codes for the eight story behavioral responses. The score has a possible range of zero to forty, with larger scores indicating a tendency to give more aggressive behavioral responses. Note that, if a single response to any of the eight stories is missing, the Aggressive Behaviors Score is missing for the respondent.

The *Percent Aggressive and Threaten Behaviors* score is calculated by dividing the number of responses coded into either the aggressive or threaten categories by the total number of behavioral responses. Higher scores indicate that aggressive responses were given more frequently than other responses.

Inter-item reliability coefficients, or Cronbach's alphas, for the items that contribute to the *Percent Hostile Attributions*, *Aggressive Behaviors Score*, and *Percent Aggressive and Threaten Behaviors* scores are shown in the table below.

The reliability coefficient for two of the scales indicated an acceptable reliability: *Percent Hostile Attributions* (both the control and normative samples) and *Percent Aggressive and Threaten Behaviors* (normative sample), ranging from .70 to .71. Two scales indicated poor reliability, with the reliability coefficients ranging from .55 to .62: *Percent Aggressive and Threaten Behaviors* (control sample) and the *Aggressive Behavior Score* (both the control and normative samples).

IV. Differences between Groups

A series of t-tests indicated no significant differences between the control and normative samples for the scales. Two of the items did show significant differences between the control and normative samples: item C4BHI9 (why didn't the other kids answer) and C4BHI10 (what would you do [about the other kids]). All of the other items did not indicate any significant differences between the samples.

In addition, the mean for the control sample for all three scales was higher than the mean for the normative sample for all three scales. However, the mean for the normative sample was higher than the mean for the control sample for 4 items: C4BHI1 (why do you think Jessica/Todd hit you), C4BHI3 (why do you think Alan/Leah said no), C4BHI10 (what would you do [about the other kids]), and C4BHI11 (why do you think Brett/Wendy bumped you).

V. Recommendations for Use

Analysts should note that the distributions for all three of the scales in both samples were fairly normal. However, some of the distributions for the items were skewed. In the normative sample, the following items were slightly and positively skewed: C4BHI4 (what would you do [about Alan/Leah]), C4BHI8 (what would you do [about Carl/Carolyn]), C4BHI10 (what would you do [about the other kids]), and C4BHI14 (what would you do [about the other kids]). Two items in the normative sample were slightly and negatively skewed: C4BHI7 (why do you think Carl/Carolyn said no) and C4BHI11 (why do you think Brett/Wendy bumped you).

In addition, in the control sample, similar items were slightly and positively skewed: C4BHI8 (what would you do [about Carl/Carolyn]), C4BHI10 (what would you do [about the other kids]), and C4BHI14 (what would you do [about the other kids]). Two items in the control sample were slightly and positively skewed (the same two as in the normative sample): C4BHI7 (why do you think Carl/Carolyn said no) and C4BHI11 (why do you think Brett/Wendy bumped you). Analysts should therefore be aware that several of the items show skewness for both the normative and control samples when they use this measure.
