I. Scale Description

In year 9 of this study, the Post-Visit Reaction Inventory is a 56-item checklist that is completed by interviewers within 24 hours after each visit. It was developed to provide staff ratings of the family's physical environment, the child's behavior toward the parent during the visit, the mother's and father's behavior toward the child during the visit, parental behavior toward the visitors and probable validity of the data, and the child's and parents' apparent need for intervention. Whereas earlier technical reports focused on specific areas (i.e. parenting, home environment), this technical report will look at the entire measure. A Post-Visit Reaction Inventory also exists for child interviewers; this version is similar to the parent version (see separate report for more detailed information).

II. Report Sample

These analyses were conducted on the first cohort on the high-risk control sample (n = 155) and the normative sample (n = 387, 463 with overlap) from the ninth year of the study. One hundred and seven records were missing the complete measure. Thirty-four records were missing from the control sample (8 from Durham, 9 from Nashville, 9 from Pennsylvania, and 8 from Washington) and 90 records were missing from the normative sample (17 from Durham, 31 from Nashville, 23 from Pennsylvania, and 19 from Washington). These numbers may reflect some overlap between the two samples.

In addition, it should also be noted that a number of items were missing a large number of responses. Items with a high missing rate included: item O9BHE7--family has a telephone (121 missing), item O9BHE10—family has a television, stereo, or radio (138 missing), item O9BHE11—basic hygiene is observed (125 missing), item O9BMB7—mother gives rationales when appropriate (141 missing), item O9BMB9--mother ignores positive behaviors of the child (153 missing), item O9BMB10—mother ignores child misbehaviors (156 missing), and items O9BFB1-O9BFB11 (approximately 407 missing) [all of the OxBFB items concern the father's behavior during the interview].

III. Scaling

The 56 items are divided into the following sections in the measure: items 1-18 report on the family's physical environment, including the availability of books, whether the family owns a television or radio, how clean the house is, the noise level of the neighborhood, and the safety of the neighborhood (items 1-10 are reverse-scored); items 19-25 describe the child's behavior toward the parent, such as complying with a request or talking positively with a parent; items 26-36 describe the mother's behavior toward the child, such as expressing anger toward the child or positively reinforcing the child's behaviors; items 37-47 describe the father's behavior toward the child using the same questions as for the mother; items 48-50 and 52-54 report on the parent's behavior toward the interviewer/visitor, such as the level of the family's preparation for the visit or the level of difficulty in completing the interview by the interviewer; and items 58-60 report whether the child and his/her family is in apparent need of interventions, such as academic, behavior, or marital. The scoring for each item varies depending on which section of the measure it is part of and is included below in the scale descriptions.

Previously, in years 1 through 7, this measure consisted of 60 items which included all of the above items as well as several more reflecting the degree of child-friendliness (indoor and outdoor play areas, toys, books) as well as assessing whether the child and the family were in need of interventions, such as working on the child's social skills or marital counseling for the parent. Beginning in year 8 of the study, specific questions about the need for interventions for the child were dropped from the measure. In year 11, the questions concerning interventions for the parents as well as several questions concerning the home were dropped from the measure. Several items, those involving parent interventions and the validity of the study, were recoded in the datasets as other items were dropped from the measure.

There are eight subscales for this measure. All subscales are summary scores that are factor-based or theoretically derived and are calculated using weighted sum scores by: 1) summing the items for each scale, 2) dividing the number of items present for each subject, and 3) multiplying by the number of items on the scale.

The first scale measures *Harsh/Physical Discipline*. Items included in this scale are items 26-30. These items are rated on a scale of 0 (can't rate), 1 (didn't occur), 2 (once), and 3 (more than once). Items include the mother shouting at the child, mother expressing anger toward the child, mother threatening the child, mother using sarcasm toward the child, and mother hitting the child.

The second scale measures *Parental Warmth* and includes items 31, 33, and 36. These items are rated on a scale of 0 (can't rate), 1 (didn't occur), 2 (once), and 3 (more than once). Items include mother speaking to the child in a positive tone, mother giving attention to the child when the child is talking, and mother positively reinforcing positive child behaviors.

The next scale measures *Child Warmth toward Mother* and includes items 21, 22, and 24. These items are the child doing something extra positive for the parent, the child talking positively with the parent, and the child being physically affectionate with the parent. These items are rated on a scale of 0 (can't rate), 1 (didn't occur), 2 (once), and 3 (more than once).

The fourth scale measures *Child Noncompliance toward Mother* and includes items 20, 23, and 25. These items are the child refusing to comply with a parental request or command, the child verbalizing anger toward the parent, and the child being physically aggressive toward the parent. These items are rated on a scale of 0 (can't rate), 1 (didn't occur), 2 (once), and 3 (more than once).

The fifth scale reports the *Child-Friendly Interior*. Items included in this scale are items 1-6, 8, and 9 and are reverse-scored and rated on a scale of 0 (can't rate), 1 (no), and 2 (yes). These items are whether the child has indoor and outdoor play areas, whether there are age-appropriate toys for the child, whether the child has a place for his/her own personal things, whether the physical environment allows for free movement for the child, and whether the family has a pet.

The sixth scale reports on the *Utilities* for the family. This scale is reverse-scored so the scale is 0 (can't rate), 1 (no), and 2 (yes), and includes items 7 (whether the family has a telephone) and 10 (whether the family has a television, stereo, or radio). For this scale only, the items are summed to create a score.

The next scale is *Home Environment*. This scale includes 3 items: 12 (how clean is this dwelling), 13 (how safe is the interior of the building), and 14 (how many rooms are in this dwelling). All 3 items are rated on a 5-point scale, with a 1 on items 12 and 13 indicating a low score and a 4 indicating a high score. A zero for all 3 items indicates that the item could not be rated. For item 14, the 5-point scale indicates a range of rooms, with a 1 representing a low number and a 4 representing a high number (6 or more).

The last scale is *Neighborhood Environment* and includes 4 items. The items are 15 (how safe is the area outside of this dwelling), 16 (describes the street where the dwelling is located), 17 (the noise level of the neighborhood), and 18 (the safety of the neighborhood). Item 15 was reversed such that: 1 = very safe, 2 = average, 3 = slightly dangerous, and 4 = very dangerous. Item 16 was recoded such that: 1 = rural, 2 = mainly residential, 3 = mixed residential/commercial, 4 = mostly commercial. For items 17 and 18, a low score represents a positive rating, while a high score represent a negative rating. A high score for this scale would indicate that the family is living in a very unsafe neighborhood.

For any item whose choices included "Can't rate" as a response, these responses were converted to missing for the purpose of analysis.

Cronbach's alphas were calculated for each subscale and are shown in the table below:

All scales showed a moderate to high level of internal consistency except for one scale. One scale, *Utilities*, showed an inadequate level of internal consistency.

IV. Differences Between Groups

A series of t-tests between the high-risk control sample and the normative sample (excluding the overlap) indicated significant differences for three of the subscales: *Harsh/Physical Discipline*, *Child-Friendly Interior*, and *Home Environment*. In addition, three of the subscales revealed that the mean for the normative sample was greater than the mean for the control sample. These were *Parental Warmth toward Child*, *Child-Friendly Interior*, and *Home Environment*.

Two items also indicated significant differences between the normative and control samples. They were the mother's receptivity toward the visitors (O9BRV2) and whether the parents need social work intervention (O9BRV8).

Analysts should also note that extremely low small sample sizes were recorded for many of the father items. The t-tests for these items do not therefore give a clear picture for these items, particularly the following items: the father shouts at the child (O9BFB1), the father expresses anger toward the child (O9BFB2), the father threatens the child (O9BFB3), the father uses sarcasm toward the child (O9BFB4), the father hits the child (O9BFB5), the father ignores the positive behaviors of the child (O9BFB9), and the father ignores the child misbehaviors (O9BFB10).

V. Recommendations for Use

Analysts should note that three of the subscales showed a fairly normal distribution for both the normative and control samples. These subscales were *Child Warmth toward Parent*, *Child-Friendly Interior*, and *Neighborhood Environment*. Two subscales, *Harsh/Physical Discipline* and *Child Noncompliance*, were positively skewed for both the normative and control samples. The *Utilities* subscale was negatively skewed for both samples. The *Parental Warmth toward Child* subscale was normally distributed for the control sample but was positively skewed for the normative sample. The *Home Environment* subscale was normally distributed for the control sample but was negatively skewed for the normative sample.

Two subscales, *Harsh/Physical Discipline* and *Child Noncompliance*, showed a floor effect for both the normative and control samples. The *Harsh/Physical Discipline* subscale reported 87% of the responses in the normative sample and 81% of the responses in the control sample to be 5 (the lowest possible score). The *Child Noncompliance* subscale reported 83% of the normative sample and 81% of the control sample to be 3 (the lowest possible score). Analysts should use caution with both of these subscales.

The *Utilities* subscale showed a ceiling effect for both the normative and control samples. For the *Utilities* subscale, 98% of the responses for the normative sample and 98% of the responses in the control sample were 2, the highest possible score. It should also be noted that the *Utilities* subscale is composed of only two items, OxBHE7 and OxBHE10. The variance for one of the items, O9BHE10, was 0.00 for both the normative and control samples.

The sample sizes for the items about the father's behaviors were quite low for both samples. Analyses such as t-tests on these items, O9BFB1-O9BFB11, reported sample sizes as low as 18 for the control sample and as low as 36 for the normative sample. Data for these items should be read with caution.
