## I. Scale Description

The Post-Intervention Ratings of Child and Parent Change (Grade 4+) is a 25-item instrument that measures parent's perceptions of change of their own behavior and of their child's behavior. In the first 9 items, the parent is asked to rate the degree of behavior change of the target child, using a -3 to +3 scale (much worse, somewhat worse, a little worse, no change, a little improved, somewhat improved, much improved). In the following 16 items, the parent is asked to rate the change of his/her own behavior towards the target child, using the same -3 to +3 scale.

## II. Report Sample

This technical report is based upon Year 5, Cohort 1 data, including both High-Risk Control and Normative samples. With missing cases excluded, the total N (including overlap) was 420, with 350 normative and 141 high-risk control youth.

Parents of 43 youth (9% of cohort) were missing observations for the entire measure, including parents of 37 Normative youth (10%) and parents of 14 High-Risk Control youth (9%). Most of the missing data are due to attrition from the baseline Fast Track sample at Year 1. The missing cases included 8 parents from the Durham site, 10 parents from Nashville, 14 parents from Pennsylvania, and 11 parents from Seattle. Data were missing for 17 girls and 26 boys. Ethnic breakdown for missing data was: 1 Asian, 13 Black, 1 Hispanic, 26 White, 2 Other. In addition, 23 cases were missing responses for individual ratings.

## III. Scaling

Exploratory factor analyses were conducted using the normative sample to inform scaling, separately for the Child and the Parent items (see Addendum). The two parent items on Social Cognition (parent items 3 & 4) were not included in the analysis due to a theoretical interest in preserving them in their own scale. Combining the factor analysis results with this theoretically-based distinction, three scales were constructed. Each scale score was calculated by taking an average of the items comprising the scale. None of the observations were missing 50% or more data. The resulting scales, items that compose them, and internal consistencies (Cronbach's coefficient Alpha) are provided below.

## IV. <u>Differences Between Groups</u>

A series of independent t-tests were conducted to assess differences between the Low Risk respondents (Normative sample excluding the overlapping High Risk Subjects, n = 279) and the High Risk Control sample (including 71 overlapping Normative youth, n = 141). Results indicated that the High Risk Control respondents had significantly higher scores on Parent Behavior Change and Parent Social Cognition scales (indicating more positive change) than did the Low Risk respondents.

## V. Recommendations for Use

Factor analyses suggest that this measure yields rather global measures of parent and child change, rather than specific domains of change. This may be because parents tended to indicate similar levels of change across different behaviors.

# Grade 4/Year 5 FAST Track Project Technical Report Cari McCarty & Suzanne Doyle 12/8/00

This addendum is based upon Year 5, Cohort 1, Normative sample data without any missing items (n=343). Scales for the Post Intervention Ratings of Change (Grade 4+) measure were created on the basis of exploratory factor analyses using an Alpha extraction with a varimax rotation. Separate analyses were conducted on the Parent and Child Items, and Parent items 3 and 4 were excluded from the analysis and preserved in their own separate scale.

The number of factors retained was derived by considering the magnitude of the eigenvalues, scree plots, the proportion of variance extracted, and interpretability of the resulting factors.

## 1. Parent Behavior Items.

The results for the Parent Items (excluding items 3 & 4) indicated one factor, accounting for 56% of the total variance. The eigenvalue for this factor was 13.00. Communality estimates ranged from .39 to .69, with an average of .56. Coefficient alpha prior to the rotation was approaching 1.0.

# 2. Child Behavior Items.

The results for the Child Items also indicated one factor, accounting for 50% of the total variance. The eigenvalue for this factor was 8.91. Communality estimates ranged from .23 to .67, with an average of .50. Coefficient alpha prior to the rotation was approaching 1.00.
