#### I. Survey Description

The Tobacco, Alcohol and Drugs survey is a 57-item instrument based on measures used in the National Longitudinal Study of Adolescent Health. This measure was first added to the Fast Track Protocol in study year 8. This measure assesses tobacco, alcohol and illegal drug use. Report of use of legal and illegal drugs prompts further questions about frequency of use and type of substances used. The response options vary based on the type of question asked (e.g., yes-no and open-ended responses).

## II. Report Sample

These analyses were conducted for the first cohort on the high-risk ControlControl sample (n = 131) and the NormativeNormative sample (n = 254) for the eighth year of the study. The distribution of respondents by site was as follows: for the ControlControl sample, 34 were from Durham, 34 were from Nashville, 34 were from Pennsylvania and 29 were from Washington. For the NormativeNormative sample, 76 were from Durham, 49 were from Nashville, 73 were from Pennsylvania and 56 were from Washington. Seventy-eight records were missing for year 8.

Table 1 shows the number of participants who used tobacco, drugs and alcohol. The most commonly used substance was tobacco (i.e., cigarettes). The second most commonly use substance was alcohol.

Very few of the participants in the ControlControl (n=10) and NormativeNormative (n=9) samples engaged in illegal drug use.

Table 2 shows the age of members of the ControlControl group at first use of tobacco, alcohol or drugs. First use is more prevalent from age 12 and older.

Table 3 shows the age of members of the NormativeNormative group at first use of tobacco, alcohol or drugs. For the NormativeNormative sample, first use is more prevalent from age 11 and older.

## III. <u>Differences Between Groups</u>

Table 4.

Table 4 shows the association between sample and tobacco use. Respondents from the ControlControl sample are more likely to use tobacco than those from the NormativeNormative sample.

#### IV. Recommendations for Use

The Tobacco, Alcohol and Drugs Survey allows for the standardization of data collection regarding the participant's substance and illegal drug use. The survey measures key factors related to the participant's tobacco, drug and alcohol use. Group comparisons are available for the researcher to compare the frequency and onset of drug, tobacco, and alcohol use which might differ between the NormativeNormative and ControlControl samples. The user is encouraged to examine the sizes of the cells. The high standard errors displayed below are indicative of very low counts.
